## FACTS ABOUT DRINKING AND DRIVING

- Motor Vehicle Crashes are the leading cause of death among 15-20 year olds, with nearly one-third of those being alcohol-impaired cases.
- You are four times likelier to die in a drunk-driving accident at night than in the day time.
- In 2006, 25% of 15 to 20 year olds who are killed in motor vehicle crashes had a BAC of .08 or higher.
  - So far, about 1665 individuals have had drunk driving related-deaths this year.
  - People between ages 15 to 34 are likelier to drive under the influence
  - In 2003, about 1.4 million people were arrested for Driving under the Influence.
- If you are caught with a DUI conviction, your car insurance rates will definitely fly up.
- A Texas judge once sentenced a drunk driver who killed another man to go to the scene of the crash for the next four



Saturdays for 8 hours wearing a sign stating that he killed someone while driving drunk.

- About 1 in 3 Americans will be involved in a motor vehicle crash involving alcohol sometime in his/her life.
- 10% of all motor vehicle crashes are due to the drinking of alcohol.
- In the year 2009, at least one person would die every 48 minutes as a result from alcohol impairment or at the hands of an alcohol impaired driver.
- Each year, alcohol-related crashes cost the United States more than \$80 Billion.
