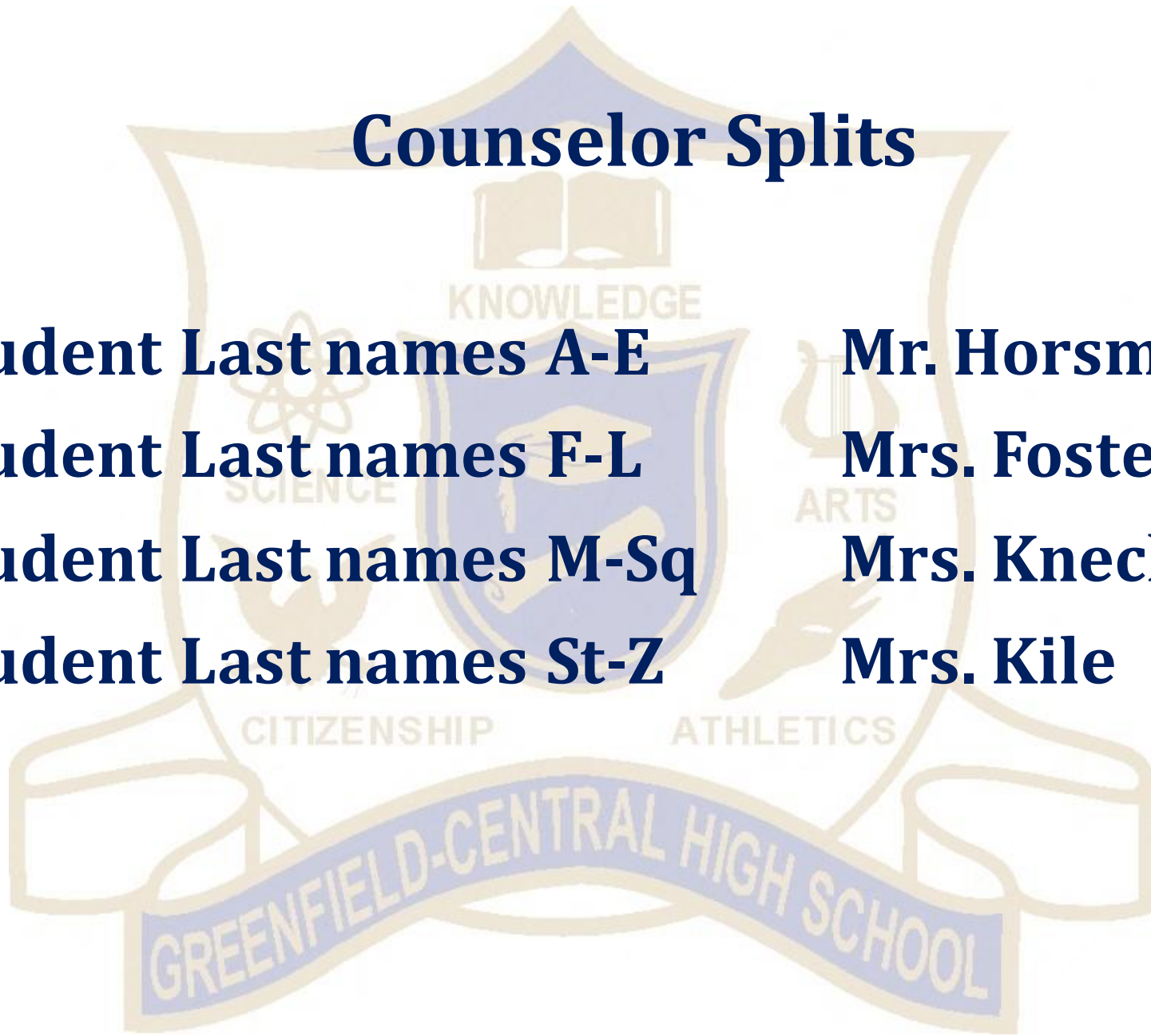

# INDIANA CORE40

Effective beginning with students who enter high school in 2012-13 school year (class of 2016).

## CORE40 with Academic Honors *(minimum 47 credits)*

For the **Core 40 with Academic Honors** diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 2 additional Core 40 math credits.
- Earn 6-8 Core 40 world language credits (6 credits in one language or 4 credits each in two languages).
- Earn 2 Core 40 fine arts credits.
- Earn a grade of a "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following:
  - A. Earn 4 credits in 2 or more AP courses and take corresponding AP exams
  - B. Earn 6 verifiable transcribed college credits in dual credit courses from priority course list
  - C. Earn two of the following:
    1. A minimum of 3 verifiable transcribed college credits from the priority course list,
    2. 2 credits in AP courses and corresponding AP exams,
    3. 2 credits in IB standard level courses and corresponding IB exams.
  - D. Earn a combined score of 1750 or higher on the SAT critical reading, mathematics and writing sections and a minimum score of 530 on each
  - E. Earn an ACT composite score of 26 or higher and complete written section
  - F. Earn 4 credits in IB courses and take corresponding IB exams.

<b>English/ Language Arts</b>	<b>8 credits</b> Including a balance of literature, composition and speech.
<b>Mathematics</b>	<b>6 credits (in grades 9-12)</b> 2 credits: Algebra I 2 credits: Geometry 2 credits: Algebra II <small>Or complete Integrated Math I, II, and III for 6 credits. Students must take a math or quantitative reasoning course each year in high school</small>
<b>Science</b>	<b>6 credits</b> 2 credits: Biology I 2 credits: Chemistry I or Physics I or Integrated Chemistry-Physics 2 credits: any Core 40 science course
<b>Social Studies</b>	<b>6 credits</b> 2 credits: U.S. History 1 credit: U.S. Government 1 credit: Economics 2 credits: World History/Civilization or Geography/History of the World
<b>Directed Electives</b>	<b>5 credits</b> World Languages Fine Arts Career and Technical Education
<b>Physical Education</b>	<b>2 credits</b>
<b>Health and Wellness</b>	<b>1 credit</b>
<b>Electives*</b>	<b>6 credits</b> <small>(College and Career Pathway courses recommended)</small>

## CORE40 with Technical Honors *(minimum 47 credits)*

For the **Core 40 with Technical Honors** diploma, students must:

- Complete all requirements for Core 40.
- Earn 6 credits in the college and career preparation courses in a state-approved College & Career Pathway and one of the following:
  1. Pathway designated industry-based certification or credential, or
  2. Pathway dual credits from the lists of priority courses resulting in 6 transcribed college credits
- Earn a grade of "C" or better in courses that will count toward the diploma.
- Have a grade point average of a "B" or better.
- Complete one of the following,
  - A. Any one of the options (A - E) of the Core 40 with Academic Honors

# ISTEP+ Graduation Examination Requirements for the Class of 2018

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- Algebra I End-of-course Assessment (ECA)
- English 10 End-of-course Assessment (ECA)
- All Indiana students are required to pass the Algebra I and English 10 ECAs in order to graduate.
- Students will have multiple opportunities to take the assessments.
- Waiver options are available, *but students must take advantage of remediation opportunities – Math Lab, ELA Lab, and Developmental Reading, if recommended. Students who need a work-readiness waiver will have to earn an approved certification in order to qualify.*
- Students are required to *take* the Biology I ECA, but a passing score is not required to graduate.

# ISTEP+ Graduation Examination Requirements for the Classes of 2019 & 2020

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- Students in the class of 2019 will need to take ISTEP+ exams for their graduation requirement.
- Students will take an ISTEP+ exam in their 10<sup>th</sup> grade English class and their 10<sup>th</sup> grade math class. They must pass both of these exams prior to graduation.
- Students will also take a science ISTEP+ exam when they take Biology. Students in the class of 2019 who took the Biology ECA in 8<sup>th</sup> grade have completed their science test requirement.





# **New Courses for 2017-18**

# New Courses at G-CHS for 2017-18

- AP Art History
  - 2 semesters – all grade levels

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- AP Computer Science Principles
  - 2 semesters – recommended grades 11 & 12 (must have completed Algebra I)
- Web Design
  - 1 semester – recommended grades 11 & 12
  - Required prerequisite: Digital Applications and Communications
- *Principles of Business Management (offered first time 2018-19)*
  - *2 semesters – recommended grades 11 & 12*
  - *Recommended prerequisite: Introduction to Business*
- Principles of Marketing (take in 2017-18 if interested in Business Management)
  - 2 semesters – recommended grades 11 & 12
- Honors Geometry
  - Recommended for students currently in 8<sup>th</sup> grade Algebra I earning an A or B or current G-CHS students in Algebra I with a teacher recommendation

# Tips for Scheduling On-line

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- (F) means “first” or “fall” semester.
- (S) means “second” or “spring” semester.
- You must pick both the (F) & (S) section of a year-long course, including EBs.
- Remember, some classes are just one semester and need to be paired with another one semester class in order for you to have a full schedule.
- Don't forget to add classes you need to re-take due to a failing grade.

# Tips for Scheduling On-line

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- Seniors: counselors will not accept half-day schedules unless you have a demonstrated hardship that requires you to work.
- All students will be asked to sign a scheduling agreement prior to selecting classes.
- The electronic scheduling feature is only for the 2017-18 school year; not summer school. Counselors will discuss summer school with you during your individual scheduling sessions.



<b>English</b>	Click the edit button to request a course ⇒	 
Select 2 Senior English credits along with any English in which you have not earned credit.		
<b>Math</b>	Click the edit button to request a course ⇒	 
Core40 students must complete a Quantitative Reasoning class each year. Academic Honors students must complete 8 semesters of Math credits in grades 9-12. Select your Senior Math plus any Math class in which you have not already earned credit.		
<b>Science</b>	Click the edit button to request a course ⇒	 
Students must earn 6 credits in Science. 2 credits in Biology, 2 in Chem/Phys/ICP, and 2 additional Science credits.		
<b>Social Studies</b>	Click the edit button to request a course ⇒	 
Seniors must earn credit in both Government and Economics.		
<b>World Language</b>	Click the edit button to request a course ⇒	 
Academic Honors requires 3 years of World Language in one language or 2 years of 2 different languages. Core 40 does not have a foreign language requirement, but universities prefer a minimum of 2 years.		
<b>PE/Health</b>	Click the edit button to request a course ⇒

# Summer School

- Dates: June 5 – June 30 (as of today)

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  - Courses being offered (must have at least 15 in each class for it to be offered)
    - Government
    - Pre-Calculus (F)
    - Algebra I (F) & (S)
    - Geometry (F) & (S)
    - Health
    - Physical Education
  - Cougar Academy/IOA Courses
  - Many courses are available online through Cougar Academy or Indiana Online Academy (IOA)
- Courses are \$30 and you must pay at the time of registration.*
- Don't forget that you can re-take a course for a better grade if you received a D+ or lower.*

# Summer School – Laptop Availability

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## Classroom Classes

Students taking summer school classes, other than PE, in the classroom will receive their laptops back on the first day of summer school and will be allowed to keep them as long as they are attending class. They will be expected to return them on either their last day of summer school or at any time they reach their withdrawal date for non-attendance.

## Cougar Academy Online Classes

Students taking online summer school classes will receive their laptops back on the first day of summer school and will be allowed to keep them as long as they are actively working on their class(es). They will be expected to return them on the day they take their last final.
