



Selection Criteria: Selection will be based on financial need (50%), academics (20%), work ethic (15%), and community service (15%).

Supporting Materials Required: 1) 500-word or less essay sharing life lessons learned thus far and future plans; and 2) Information from your FAFSA Report

Scholarship Selection Process

- Competitive Scholarships: available to graduating seniors, college students and non-traditional students county-wide.
- School Specific Scholarships: available to graduating seniors of the school that is specifically named.
- Scholarships open to college students: look for the green square.

Evaluation &

Evaluators are given the scholarship criteria for each scholarship and asked to blindly (without reference to personal information) evaluate each application to determine the most qualified applicant for each specific scholarship based on the selection criteria.

Selection

Selections are made by one of two committees: the HCCF Scholarship committee or a School Selection committee. These committees recommend recipients to the HCCF Board of Directors for approval.

Applications are evaluated blindly (without name and contact info)

Timeline for Scholarships

- October 1, 2018: FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) Application opens around this time at https://fafsa.ed.gov. Parent and student Tax Information for 2017 is used for this application. FAFSA results, including Estimated Family Contribution (EFC) and estimated Pell Grant award will be needed for many of the HCCF Scholarship applications. G-CHS FAFSA Night is Tuesday, October 30 from 2:00-7:30 p.m. Another one will be held Saturday, February 2 at Hancock County Public Library. A representative from INvestED will be present to assist.
- Early October: All Hancock County Seniors will receive a Scholarship Guidebook from HCCF in the mail. Scholarships available through HCCF will be described and information regarding how to apply is included.
- November 1, 2018: HCCF Scholarship Applications go live online. They can be accessed at www.giveHCgrowHC.org.
- February 8, 2019, 4:00 p.m.: HCCF Scholarship Applications close.
- April 15, 2019: Deadline for filing FAFSA Applications. Some colleges may require earlier filing deadlines in order to prepare your financial aid package in a timely manner. Check with your college(s) to determine their requirements for completing the FAFSA application.
- Late April, 2019: All HCCF Scholarship recipients will be notified of total amount of scholarship awards.
- High School Senior Awards Program: Recipients will be notified of specific scholarships awarded.
- Hancock County Fair- 4-H Scholarship Recipients will be announced.

3 Reasons to Complete the FAFSA

- 1. To qualify for other kinds of scholarships and grants. Some financial aid programs require a FAFSA even though they award aid without regard to family income.
- 2. To get cheap, forgivable federal loans. The FAFSA automatically qualifies the student for low-interest and forgivable federal student loans.
- **3. To gain an admissions edge.** In some cases, filing a FAFSA can actually help a student gain admission to a college.

- Record volunteer work
- Create list of activities throughout high school years
- Identify recommenders
- Create permanent email address
- Choose top 3 colleges
- Prepare essays
- File your FAFSA

Preparing to Apply for Scholarships:

- Keep track of volunteer work, including place/organization, specific work done and hours worked. It is also a good idea to know the name of the person supervising the volunteer work. Many HCCF scholarships are based on your contribution to the community.
- Create a list of all the clubs and extracurricular activities you have participated in by the year that you were in them during high school, along with the leaders or advisors. These are activities that are affiliated with your high school, as well as those that you belong to outside your high school.
- Identify two or three good people to submit reference letters. At least one should be a teacher and none should be relatives. Employers, club leaders, pastors, nonprofit operators where you volunteer are all possibilities. They should be aware that they will be getting a request for a letter of recommendation. NOTIFY THEM EARLY IN THE APPLICATION PROCESS SO THAT THEY HAVE TIME TO RESPOND.
- Create or use an email address <u>not</u> associated with your high school for the application process. Be sure to check this email address often after applications are submitted. You may be asked to participate in an interview process and will be notified by email. The scholarships will follow you to college and sometimes beyond.
- Now your top three college choices. Do research this summer if you are not yet sure of your college choices. Some scholarships are only awarded to students if they are going to a college in the state of Indiana. Others are for specific colleges. Study the Guidebook that you will receive in October to determine what scholarships you will be eligible for based on your college choice.
- Write a basic essay specific to your intended career, if you know what it is. In the essay address:
 - Why the career interests you
 - How you are currently preparing for it (high school classes, vocational program, job, internships, volunteer experiences, etc.)
 - How your college or program choice will help you reach your goal
 - What you expect to be doing in this career in ten years.
 - You will need to tweak this to fit specific scholarship requirements, but if you have this already created, modifying it will be a simple task.
- File your FAFSA information as early as possible after October 1. Collect other Financial Need information as described on the Financial Need Information Form.

After typing in the email address for the person who will complete that section for you, click **Compose Email**.


In your email, let them know what you need, and include any other information as instructed on the Application.


Click **Continue**. You'll be brought to the first Application with supplemental questions.

If you elect to apply for the additional opportunity, complete the questions and hit "Submit Application"


